MALEEHA LODHI RAISES HER VOICE AGAINST HUMANITARIAN CRISIS!

Pakistan's Permanent Representative to United Nations Dr Maleeha Lodhi apprised the UN Secretary-General regarding the humanitarian crisis in Indian Occupied Kashmir (IOK).

THE AMBASSADOR took to social media to state that she met with Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and emphasised the urgency of dealing with the atrocities in the occupied valley.

She noted that it was day 36 of the curfew imposed by the Indian armed forces.

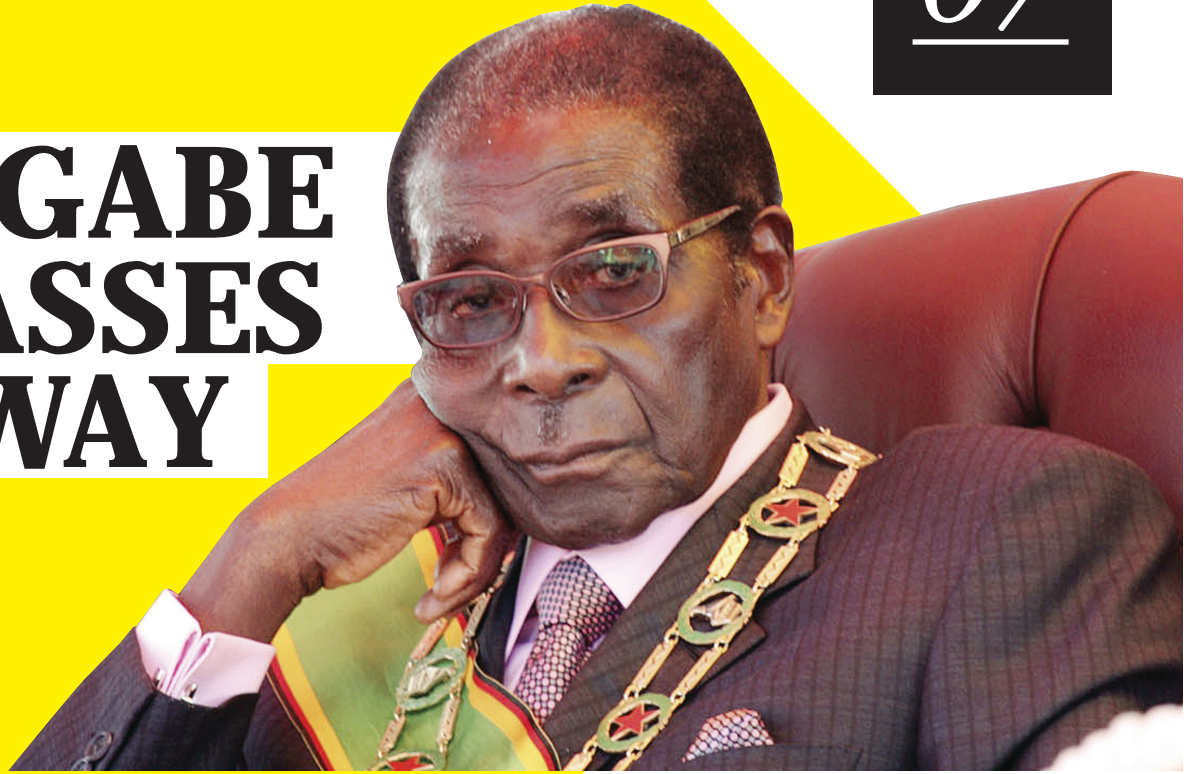
Ambassador Lodhi briefed the secretary-general about the political and humanitarian crisis after India's illegal annexation of IOK which is threatening global peace and security. Previously, Lodhi met with the UN Security Council (UNSC) President Joanna Wronecka and briefed her about India's illegal actions.

The meeting was held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York where Lodhi apprised Wronecka about India's continued violations of UNSC resolutions.

Lodhi also handed a letter from Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi to UN Secretary-General António Guterres asking him to ensure full compliance of its own resolutions in IoK.

The letter, 'categorically rejects the illegal Indian annexation of occupied J&K in express violation of SC resolutions'. ■

MUGABE PASSES AWAY



Mr Mugabe was a rebel leader who swept to power after Zimbabwe's independence from Britain and went on to rule for 37 years until he was ousted in the year 2017. He died on September 6, 2019 at the age of 95.

HIS HEALTH deteriorated after he was toppled by the military and former loyalists in November 2017, ending an increasingly iron-fisted rule that sent the economy into ruin.

He died after receiving treatment at a Singapore hospital for several months.

A delegation including Vice President Kembo-Mohadi travelled there on a chartered flight to bring his body back to Zimbabwe.

A hearse transporting Mr Mugabe's body left a Singapore funeral home bound for an airport and accompanied by a police escort, driving past a group of waiting journalists.

Zimbabweans have been divided over how to mourn a former leader once hailed as a liberation hero, but who later brutally repressed his opponents.

He was initially praised for ridding the former British colony Rhodesia of white minority rule, but later used repression and fear to govern until he was finally ousted.

His increasingly tyrannical leadership and economic mismanagement prompted millions to leave the country.

Following his death, President Emmerson Mnangagwa announced he had been declared a "national hero",

flags flew at half-mast across Harare and news of his passing was splashed across newspaper front pages.

Yet Harare residents appeared largely unconcerned, with shops remaining open and people going about their daily errands. ■



MATHIRA LASHES OUT AT MALALA

Malala Yousafzai came under fire when she tweeted about the new iPhone on the day it was launched but remained quiet on the brutalities taking place in Indian Occupied Kashmir!

AT A RECENT event in California, Apple unveiled its new iPhone 11 pro along with new iPad models and a streaming TV service. While the device's price seemed unreasonable to a large number of people, the tech giant was mocked for its redundant change in designs.

This time, it was the triple-camera that sparked conversation on social media. Some compared it to a stove and a coconut while others called out the new camera feature for triggering tryphobia.

However, what engaged an even larger audience into the debate was activist Malala Yousafzai. She posted a picture of her dress bearing an uncanny resemblance to the phone's triple-camera, adding to the conundrum. "Is this just a coincidence that I wore this dress on the same day as Apple iPhone 11's launch," said the Nobel laureate on Twitter.

The thread over flooded with people joining in the troll, except for a few who pointed out that Malala should call out the brutality in Indian occupied Kashmir instead of commenting on the new iPhone.

Among the critics was the notable, Mathira, who landed on the post to criticise Malala for not sticking to her genre, that is, speaking for world peace.

Mathira expressed her disappointment as she claimed that Malala should have tweeted against Priyanka and the Kashmir issue instead of 'worrying' about her dress.

Her comment remained influential as it reiterated the public sentiment. Although some were amused by the



role reversal as the young activist cracked a joke while the entertaining Mathira felt offended, what flared up the controversy, were the people who began arguing among themselves as to what a peace representative should and should not focus on.

Malala however, has not responded to any remark or commented on Mathira's response, possibly projecting her silence as a gesture of the peace that is being argued upon. ■

A GREAT LOSS

Veteran Pakistani actor, director and producer Abid Ali has passed away.



ABID ALI had been ailing from a liver disease for a long time, and was being treated at a private hospital in Karachi. He was 67.

Born Abid Sher Ali in the year 1952 in Quetta, he worked as an actor, director, and producer, acting in several TV and film productions.

After working at Radio Pakistan, Abid Ali launched a successful career as an actor with the PTV drama 'Jhok Sial' in 1973. But he was perhaps best known for his role as 'Dilawar Khan' in 'Waris', the classic 1979 PTV drama serial. He was the director and producer of 'Dasht', a 1993 hit drama in which he also played the role of 'Shams Shah'.

Abid Ali is the recipient of the prestigious Pride of Performance. He has three daughters, including renowned model and actress Iman Aly and singer Rahma Ali. ■

Q Hey, I've got an evening outdoor event with my friends and I want to wear a long halter gown. How should I cover it up?

A Since it's an evening event with friends you could totally cover up that halter with faux fur when the night gets chilly. Keeping it chic yet super sexy.

Q How can a beautiful, proportional and very curvy plus size like myself wear leggings or skinny jeans without my legs looking huge?

A When picking leggings or skinnies, stick to dark tones: black, inky indigo, charcoal, even dark burgundies or teals. (Brighter colours will emphasise thighs; darker colours will tone them.) For a flattering alternative to skinny jeans, look for slim or straight-leg cuts. Wear brightly coloured or embellished blouses and tees that will draw the eye. To visually lengthen your look, finish it with a cardigan or jacket — tuxedo style is a great pick — that hits mid-thigh.

Q I need help figuring out how to style all the ankle boots that are now out. Tuck skinny jeans in? Roll them?

A Rolling your jeans and showing off a little skin between cuff and top of boot is a younger, hipper look. This look also works better with sleeker, more feminine boots, maybe with a stacked heel — nothing about it should look clunky. Tucking your skinny jeans or leggings into boots can make you look taller and leaner because you'll create one continuous line.

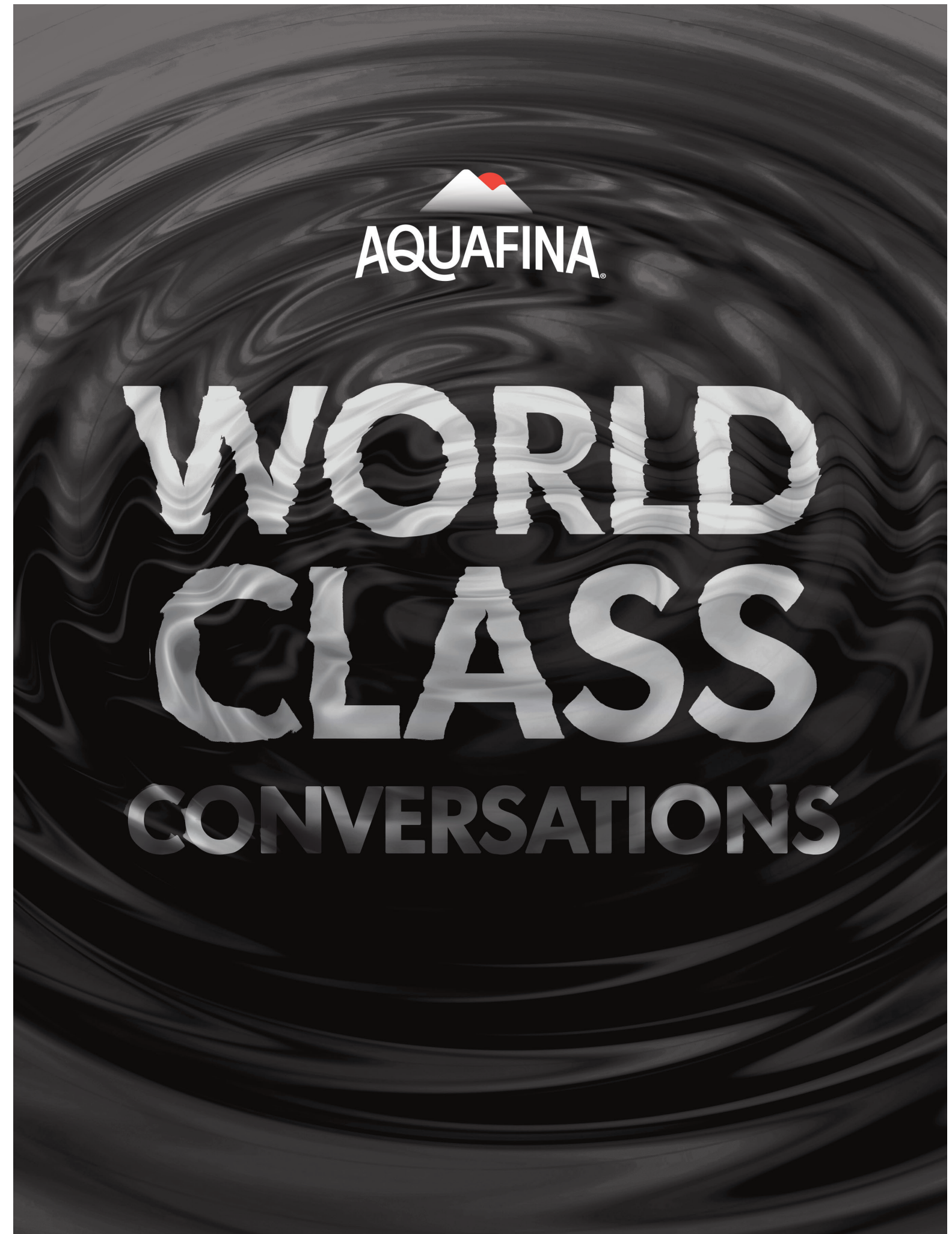

WORLD CLASS CONVERSATIONS

ROSHANAY AFRIDI

RESIDING MAINLY in the USA before moving to Pakistan to pursue modeling, Roshanay was born in Amsterdam and spent most of her early childhood in a town nearby. Later, her family moved to California where she was brought up and pursued her studies.

“I felt I got to experience a lot of different cultures since I lived in California which is a melting pot of different cultures,” she said while telling us about her life in the Golden State.

Unknown to many, the award nominated model is not just a pretty face but a true definition of beauty with brains. Having studied Psychology and medicine, Roshanay has worked in dentistry while also having studied at Oxford in UK and then in Japan.

Medicine being one of the highest paying industries in the USA, we asked Roshanay what was it about modeling that made her switch from a lucrative position to the fiercely competitive world of fashion and modeling.

“It was always something I was truly and deeply passionate about,” she said adding that she was first scouted in New York City but her parents didn’t let her pursue modeling at that time as they wanted her to complete her education first. But as luck may have it, Roshanay was again scouted in LA when she turned 18 and was able to pursue modeling part time while also

finishing her degree before diving into the industry full time.

Telling us more about her experience working in LA, she tells us that talent recruitment is a little different there and everyone needs to bring their portfolio and a pair of black heels with them at all times. "I have worked with brands like Forever 21, Nylon, hot topic, Toni and Guy, Zara, Paul Mitchell, Toofaced to name a few but the list goes on," shares Pakistan's current brand favourite.

Having been working with some top brands in her hometown, we wondered

what was it that made her move to Pakistan and continue modeling here.

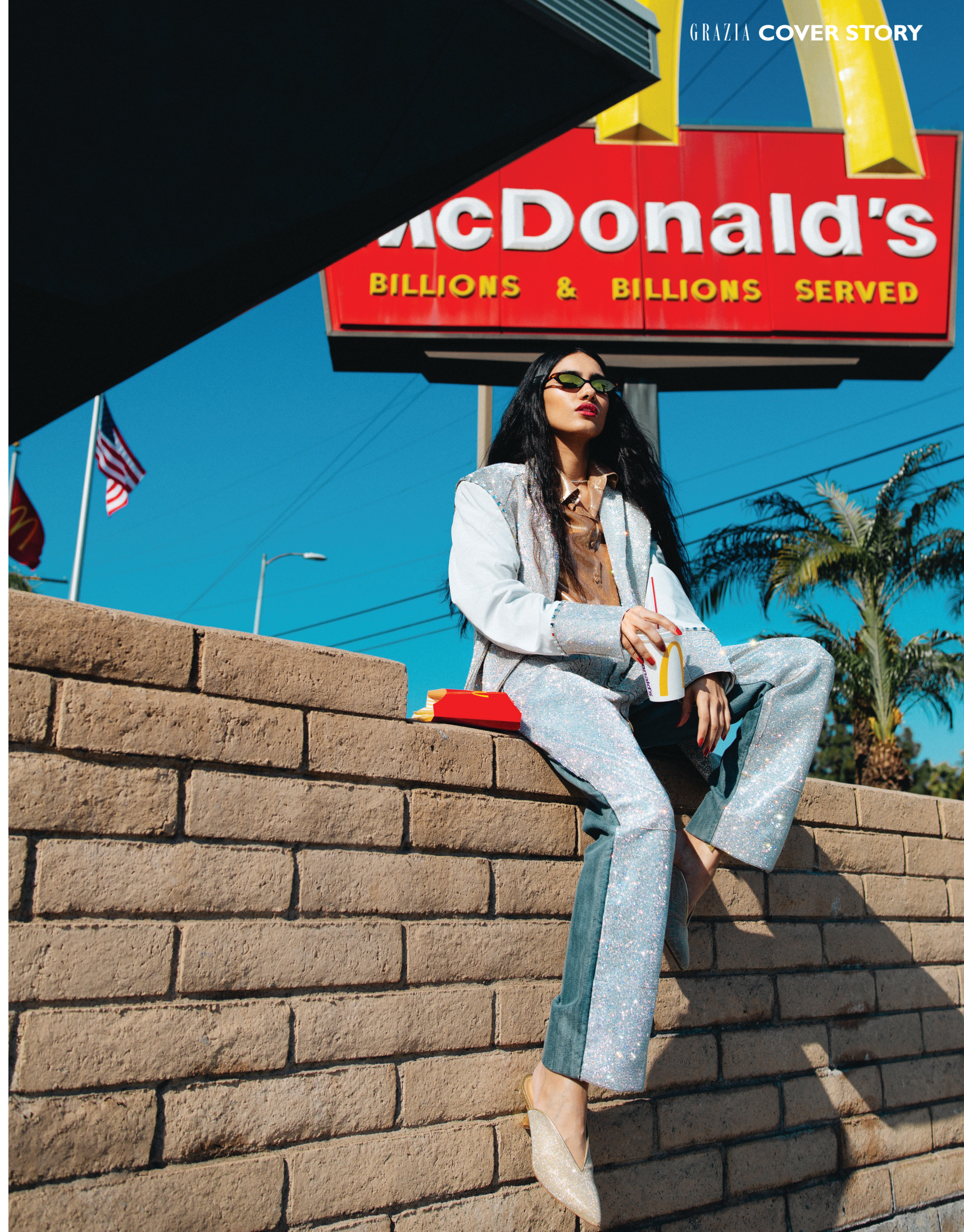
Roshanay shares that she had no plans of working here and was just visiting when she was discovered by Tabesh Khoja AKA Khoji, who convinced her to try out for a Sana Safinaz shoot— her first ever modeling gig in Pakistan. "I guess I did pretty well because they hired me right then and there and I immediately joined the shoot that was already happening with other models," she said.

Having an international element in her way of modeling, Roshanay told us that

people actually loved that about her. "My poses, camera angles, the way I model is a bit different and I think that really helped me."

However, she shared that often she had to tone it down for lawn shoots but the overall experience and appreciation has been overwhelming.

"I would only wear shalwar kameez for Eid when living abroad, so imagine going from that to having to wear it on a daily basis on shoots and making it look nice. It was very new and exciting for me," she jibes about her 'desi American problems', literally.

Having had worked with leading brands and designers like Sana Safinaz, Elan, Sunsilk, Zaha, Manish Malhotra, Sapphire, Republic Womenswear, Ethnic, Esfir and Nabilas among others, Roshanay said she's highly grateful to have had worked with all these brands here.

"I usually keep working for the same brands multiple times as I would like to hold some exclusivity and loyalty with the brands I've worked with in the past," she maintained adding that she however remains open to working with other brands as well.

Talking about her fashion week experiences and doing ramp, Roshanay said she was a little nervous during her first show but has since been opening and closing several shows. She also divulged that walks here are different from international standards and there is a lot more smiling and the walk is also slower whereas internationally, models walk in a straight line and without any expressions.

Furthermore, talking about her experience working in Pakistan so far, Roshanay said it has been incredible with most people being kind and supportive. While timing; according to her is one of the major differences she found between working abroad and in Pakistan as the former are a lot more punctual about it.

She also added that the teams there are more careful about the models' hair and skin and thinks it would be better for everyone if we adapted similar practices over here. Another difference would be shalwar kameez as she had never shot desi clothes before so understanding how to pose with them was a fun thing to learn. Nevertheless, "There is some sort of a comfort I have here which is indescribable," she said.

Regarding her decision to move to Pakistan, Roshanay said that her parents were a little concerned at first as a lot of people would tell stories of



phones being snatched and not being able to walk outside. “But now that I am here, I can tell you that it’s not the case at all,” she claimed adding that, “Karachi, honestly is a fun city to live in.”

Talking about her Lux Style Awards nomination for best emerging talent in fashion, Roshanay said it was something she had not expected to happen so early on in her career but is grateful for being nominated and for the respect and love received from the industry and people.

Not only was she nominated that night but also stood out for her beautiful silk gown, which she revealed

was something she had in mind and worked together with Mohsin and Khoji to achieve it. “I always prefer a classic look on the red carpet. I feel like these timeless looks are the ones I would like to be remembered by.”

However, we do know that a new face is always a threat in the modeling world and Roshanay revealed that she too faced a lot of opposition from models that would be kind to her face but behind her back it would be a different story and this is one of the saddest things in this industry.

“We’re supposed to support each other instead of getting threatened by each

other,” she stressed. “I understand people can feel threatened by me, but please I don’t consider anyone my competition, because I do not think this way,” she maintains adding that the only person she competes with is herself and she strives to be an even better, kinder, stronger, and more patient version of herself each day.

She also firmly believes that whatever is meant for you will be yours but most people here think that you will take their jobs from them. “I’ve even had girls go out of their way to take me out of runway shows by using their connections which really didn’t work out for them.”

"I'm saying this because I want our modeling family to be so strong and supportive that we encourage and lift each other up instead of pulling each other down," exclaimed Roshanay. However, while mentioning such incidents, Roshanay also said she felt blessed for people who have not only been encouraging but also helped her out greatly in her career.

Meanwhile, talking about models and their growing obsession with plastic surgery, Roshanay said she has seen many models be put down for their physical attributes causing them to then resort to plastic surgery and facial fillers because not feeling confident enough or being told to do so.

"I have nothing against procedures but I absolutely despise people having been told to do plastic surgery in order to be good enough for the modeling world," she said hoping for new talent to be encouraged for their looks rather than turning them into a photocopy of someone else.

As models get more and more involved in social causes, Roshanay too believes that the lack of drinking water in Pakistan is something she'd want to play a role in improving.

"This is such a basic need for every human however we still aren't able to provide clean water for our people," she expressed her concern further sharing that she had earlier worked with the UNICEF in one of their programmes for providing clean water to areas where it might not be accessible. "I hope to continue doing this work in Pakistan and would love it if others joined me as well."

Lastly, being highly interested in skin care and passionate about modeling, Roshanay finds herself being involved in either in the next five years while also hopes to launch a skincare brand all while being happy and content with wherever life takes her then.

"Don't give up. Don't give in. You are you and that's your power," she advised all aspiring models. ■

MRS. KHAN-TROVERSY!

THE NOTORIOUS RISHTA AUNTY WHO'S KNOWN FOR MATCHMAKING ARRANGED MARRIAGES, POPULARLY KNOWN AS MRS KHAN, LANDED HERSELF IN HOT WATERS WITH HER SEXIST OUTLOOK ON MARRIAGE.

DURING AN INTERVIEW with a local news channel, Mrs Khan had all the wrong suggestions to give to young women to 'make their marriages work'. Speaking on national television, Mrs Khan confidently claimed that girls should learn to control their tongues and make 'gol rotis' in order to sustain their marriage. Not only is her hot take super cliché; it's also simply ignorant.

In a study published in the Pakistan Journal of Medical Sciences, 97% of the interviewed women said they had been victims of some form of assault. An estimated 5,000 women are killed in Pakistan per year from domestic violence. In such a society, Mrs Khan's statements are incredibly harmful and perpetuating the preexisting culture of victim blaming. In fact she clearly stated it is mostly a girl's fault if her marriage ends in divorce.

Nevertheless, faith in humanity was restored when many Pakistani women criticised Mrs. Khan's outdated beliefs as she shamelessly attempted to reinforce the discriminatory gender roles that feminists



have been working so hard to counter. The extent of the online plus offline backlash led to Mrs Khan being forced to address her claims in another interview. However, not much had changed since her last slip up.

Although, she was apologetic for her tone, she couldn't be less apologetic for her words. "I do stand by what I said though. Girls should keep their mouth shut and not give a tat-for-tat response to their husband, during a heated argument" she said.

It would probably be for the best that someone with such a misogynistic mindset should not have a platform on national television nor should they be left in charge of several arranged marriages. ■

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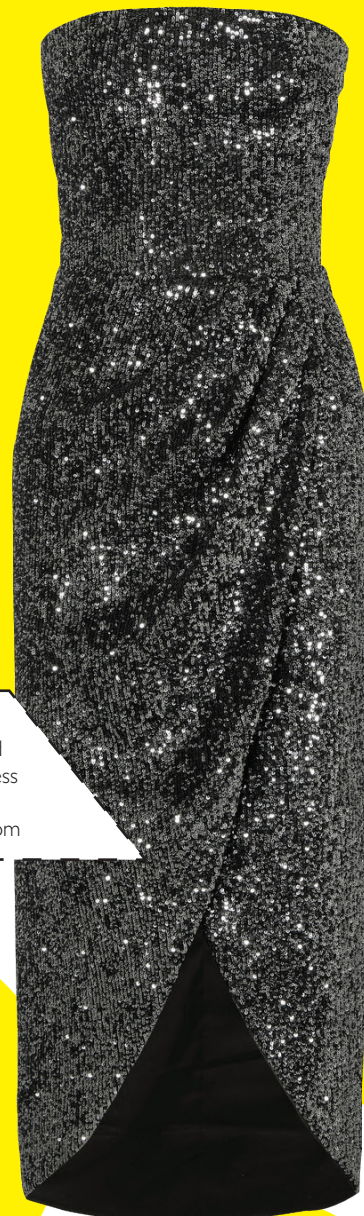

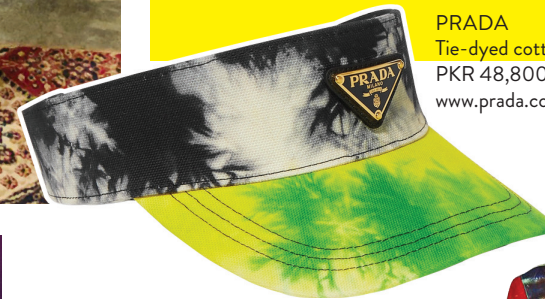

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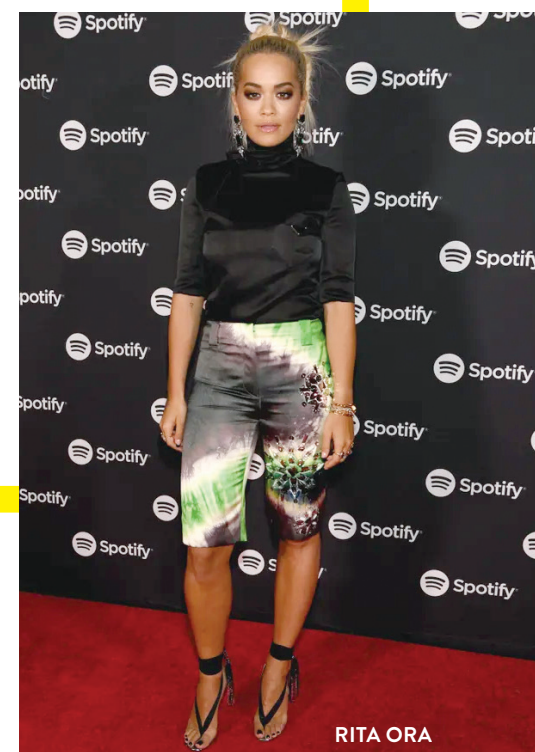
